To Remain "Ins-powered"

Can You tell us, what did You see in 2015 and what do You see now in 2018?

We started with the design in 2015. In 2016, we had 11, in 2017, 19 and now we have 42 projects. We clearly gain more interest and attraction within IOC, Olympic movement and Olympic family. At the start we were very much in an anonymous bubble - as a start up. Since Buenos Aires «Olympism in Action Forum» we have gained more momentum and visibility, YCMs have been praised for their contribution. The best proof is that IOC President nominated 7 YCMs to be members of Drafting Committee. Josefina (24) from Chile was co-chair to IOC Member John Coates.

Before YOG Nanjing 2014 You got an idea of new word «in-spover»...

I have always had a love for communications, literature, power of words, speech and slogan. It is important to carefully choose the way we translate an idea into paper, video etc. I was thinking how to transfer purpose and heart of YOG as 'life changing factory' - whoever goes through YOG should not have the same experience before and after it. It should be inspiring and empowering at the same time. I designed a sort of this value chain where I see different levels of engagement of young people and I am a strong advocate to go as far as possible with it. I came up with this idea of combining inspiration and empowerment. This is what YOG should be about - inspiring young people and empowering the best talents of each individual. Because this inspiration should go beyond just practising sport and performing.

Where do You see future of YCM+ and what learnings other organizations may take with?

I think that IOC can lead the way in the world of sport and to spread this «virus» more. We still need to develop, know how to measure impact, train skills etc. I think we have gained more momentum with support of IOC President. We see this movement more and more. World Economic Forum leads young leaders for many many years. It is also important for academics, politics, business etc.

Through YCM role founder of Excellence Academy has been working and training with junior and younger senior short track speed skating team. Two juniors will participate on EYOF 2019 in Olympic Sarajevo.

Studying now on prestigious MA Tarik (Alumni 2016) shares with us what sport means to him. He has been practicing volleyball: *"When I turn back, I can see that sport has played a great role in shaping me as a person. Through it, I have learned to be persistent even when it doesn't go well, that success doesn't fall from sky and not to give up. Above all, to go beyond an average."*

As assistant University professor Ilma (Alumni 2016) advises reading and sport as important aspects to develop non-formal academic skills: *"The last book I read and which I liked is 'Honour' by Elif Shafak. Also, I try to maintain my fitness through 'zumba training'."*

Voice to Stop Segregation "Two schools under one roof"

We are grateful that Association of high school students (ASUBiH) with President Valerija Blagojević and PRM Zerina Hubjer answered the call of the Conference in 2018. Both of them and their colleagues are excellent students and they work for ASUBiH. Zerina shared how youth strive to resist segregation that is imposed on Bosnian and Herzegovinian youth: "We went on demonstrations against new founding two schools under one roof... Afterwards, we have begun with project 'Friends without borders' in 10 cities of our country. It helps us to resist segregation..."
